Aviation Safety Bulletin

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SUBJECT :

The maintenance staff of an airline had transported AOG by air. One of the shipments contained 2 life vests and had been verified as Class 9 dangerous goods (Proper Shipper Name: Life-saving appliances; UN Number: 2990), but the shipper(Carrier) didn't declare.

BACKGROUND :

Investigation indicates that the shipper (Carrier) violates the Article 43, paragraph 2 of Civil Aviation Act and Article 10 & 11 of Regulations Governing the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air. The shipper who offers dangerous goods for transport by air shall complete and sign a DGD which bear a declaration indicating that the dangerous goods are fully and accurately described by their proper shipping names and that they are classified, packed, marked, labelled, and in proper condition for transport by air in accordance with the relevant regulations. The shipper who offers dangerous goods for transport by air shall provide to the owner or operator of an aircraft the DGD described in the preceding paragraph and other transport document. Before offering any dangerous goods for transport by air, the shipper shall ensure that the dangerous goods are properly classified, identified, packed, marked, labelled, declared and accompanied by a DGD and other transport document in accordance with Articles 3, 4, and 6-10 hereof.

RECOMMODATION :

1. Shippers shall comply with the Civil Aviation Act, Regulations Governing the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air and Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air before shipping dangerous goods by air.
2. Carriers shall enhance the training to identify dangerous goods.

OTHERS:

Regulations Governing the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air had been promulgated on FEB. 25, 2008. Any relevant organizations, enterprises, and shippers shall fully comply with the above regulations when transporting dangerous good by air. CAA had also revised and published the list of dangerous goods on Jan. 28, 2011; therefore, any person or organizations who violates the above regulations when transporting dangerous goods by air shall be subject to a fine in accordance with the Article 112-2 of Civil Aviation Act hereafter.
